



### Key dates



**October 16** — Deadline for ballots to be mailed to voters

**October 26** — Last day for online and mailed registrations or updates to be received

**October 27** — USPS recommends mailing voted ballot back one week before Election Day

**November 3** — Election Day:

- Register or update info and vote **in person** by 8 p.m.
- Mailed ballot must be **postmarked by** today
- Official ballot drop boxes are open until 8 p.m.

**November 24** — County Canvassing Boards certify General Election results

**December 3** — Last day for Secretary of State to certify General Election results

**December 14** — Electoral College casts votes




